We love sharing how wonderful your child is and what great successes they are having at school via Seesaw. Please remember Seesaw will not be used to discuss problems or concerns. Seesaw is designed to celebrate success.

All students have now been given access to Bug Club. We are using Bug Club for home reading. Bug Club is accessed via the internet. Your child would have given you a note explaining how to use bug club and passwords. If you are not sure how to access this website or would prefer a book instead please see your child's class teacher. We strongly encourage that your child is reading every night. It is really important that your child is reading and practicing their sight words/spelling words at home daily.

Please remember to label your child's belongings. Each classroom has a mountain of jumpers, hats and other items that have been left behind. If you are missing things please come and check the piles.

A reminder that your child needs to wear a school hat every day. Please make sure your child has a school hat in their bag daily. A handy tip to ensure your child does not go without a hat is: get your child to leave one hat at school in their classroom tray and to have a spare one in their school bag. FIELD OF MARS EXCURSION

I am writing about our Stage 3 excursion. We went to this amazing place called Field of Mars. They taught us about the environment and how it can be changed and managed. We were split into class groups to either go for a creek walk, bush walk or do water testing. My class, 5/6K, went for the creek walk first and talked about the environment. Our instructor's name was Phil he was a wonderful teacher. We had an iPad with us so we could take some photos. The creek walk was great fun and there were lots of things to explore. At one point we made it to a road. Phil said that a man washes his car every Saturday and all the chemicals get washed down into the creek.

We then went to do water testing. We had to pair up with someone, so I joined with my friend Brianna. We then got to join with another group of two and worked together as a team. Each group got a tool box which had safety glasses, little containers, a water bottle and a long tube with a pattern at the bottom of it. For one of our experiments we had to collect water from the creek using a pole which we attached to the bottle. We then went onto the bridge and dunked the bottle under the water in the creek. After collecting the water, we poured the water into the tube, until we couldn't see the pattern at the bottom. Our water was scored 19 out of 25 on the clear scale which was the highest in our class.

We did a few more experiments.

Then we went back to the classroom and had our lunch. After lunch, we went for a bushwalk. We all were excited because earlier that day Phil showed us where we were going for the bush walk. The bush walk went up these big hills and sometimes we had to go back down them. It was scary because sometimes there were no stairs when we were going down. We stopped a couple of times and our instructor talked about what some plants were used for. The bush walk was my favourite part of the excursion. The bush walk went for a while. I am also sure that everyone enjoyed the whole excursion because I definitely did.


